INFORMATION

SITUATION AND ACCOMMODATION

The Society's own Showground occupies approximately 200 acres and lies North of the town on the B5062 Newport to Edgmond road. It has mains water and electricity connected. Tubular stalls are erected for cattle, in addition to milking and washing facilities. Special pens are available for sheep.

CHALLENGE CUPS AND SPECIAL PRIZES

Valuable silver cups are open for competition, together with many special prizes and rosettes kindly donated by Breed Societies and supporters.

The winners of cups shall give to the Show Manager, a written guarantee to return the cup in good condition to Chadwell Grange, Newport, Shropshire TF10 9BG, not later than 2nd June in the year following the Show.

GRAND PARADE

The Grand Parade of Prize Winning Cattle and Horses will be held in the Main Ring commencing at 3.10 pm. Sheep exhibitors are also invited to join the Grand Parade.

1st and 2nd Prize Winners must join the Grand Parade, failure to parade will cause the exhibitor to forfeit the respective prize money.

CUPS

As winners, if you wish to collect your Cup they will be issued from the LIVESTOCK OFFICE, in the cattle lines after the Grand Parade but BEFORE 5pm.

Please ensure that your Prize Money is collected on Show Day - any Prize Money not collected will be deemed a donation to the Newport & District Agricultural Society

CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES

Livestock entries close on Friday 22nd June, 2018.

The Society reserves the right to cancel any section, which has less than three exhibitors when the entries are finally closed. (See By-laws 10 & 15).

PASSES

Minimum of 2 passes will be issued per exhibitor. Further passes will be issued at the discretion of the Livestock Secretary.

5-7 sheep entered - 3 passes

6-8 cattle entered - 4 passes

No vehicle passes are issued. Only vehicles transporting Livestock will be permitted in the Livestock section. Passes will be scanned at the livestock entrance

BULLS & BULL HANDLING

- a) All Bulls above one year old must have rings or "bulldogs" on their noses, and should be rung not less than 2 months before intended use of the ring as a handling aid.
- b) Bulls must be handled and led according to the Guidance Notes AIS 35 (Health and Safety Executive).
- c) All Bulls must be tied using neck ties.
- d) During the period the Show is open to the public, mature Bulls should not be left unattended.
- e) All Senior Bulls must have 2 able handlers in attendance in the Show Ring and in the Grand Parade

CATTLE TRACING SYSTEM - REPORTING MOVEMENTS TO AND FROM SHOWGROUNDS in 2018

(Show Holding Number 35/129/8002)

NDAS will record an ON / OFF movement with BCMS on the day of the show. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to record their cattle movements off their holding and back on again. On arrival at the show ground exhibitors are requested to take there cattle passports as soon as possible to the livestock office where they will be processed and immediately returned along with their exhibitor numbers. Exhibitor numbers will only be available from the livestock office on inspection of passports.

PRE MOVEMENT TB TESTING

No pre movement testing is required because Newport Show is a one day show.

AMALGAMATION OF BREED SECTIONS/CLASSES

BREED SECTION - Entries must be received from at least 3 exhibitors and 7 cattle in a Section or the Section may be cancelled or amalgamated. (See By-Law 10)

CLASSES - Classes may be amalgamated if less than 3 entries are received in a class. Exhibitors will be notified in advance.





- (c) In open penning, 2m separation will be allowed between penning of MV accredited and non-MV accredited sheep.
- (d) There will be separate watering facilities for MV accredited and non-MV accredited sheep.
- (e) MV accredited and non-MV accredited sheep may be allowed in the same ring, but should be led by a halter or collar and there should be a 2m space between different categories. It is accepted that judges will need to pass between and handle the sheep, but any examinations such as mouthing, should be carried out by the handler for the judge's inspection.
- (f) MV accredited stock which come into contact with non-MV accredited stock, in any circumstances, will immediately lose their status. If they are to return to Scheme premises they must be placed immediately in isolation and pass 2 blood tests the first straight away and the second between 6-12 months later. If both tests are clear they may rejoin their MV accredited flock. Please contact SAC Sheep & Goat Health Schemes immediately for advice, in the event of contact between MV accredited and non-MV accredited stock taking place.

All sheep exhibitors will have their completed AML 2. forms (Both in & out) collected on arrival at the Livestock gate. Return AML forms must be collected from the Livestock office (in cattle lines) between 1 - 4 pm.

Conditions under which entries are accepted

- 1 Entries close as follows: Livestock Friday 22nd June 2018. The Society reserves the right to extend any closing date.
- 2 Exhibitors shall be responsible for the accuracy and eligibility of their entries, which must be lodged with the appropriate Section Secretary on or before the dates published. Entries should be made on the forms provided and an entry will not be accepted unless accompanied by the correct entry fees and, if not already paid, subscriptions.
- 3 All exhibits must have been the bona-fide property of the exhibitor for two calendar months previous to the date of entry.
- 4 The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry and also to accept entries provisionally.
- 5 All entries must be on the showground at least one hour before their judging time. Exhibitors' admission tickets must be produced at the entrance to the livestock enclosure.
- 6 All exhibitors must bring their stock into the stalls and pens allocated to them and not allow exhibits to remain in their lorries. Exhibitors not conforming to this rule may forfeit the prize money.
- 7 Attendants in charge of exhibits will be required to remain with the same and exhibits shall not be left unattended
- 8 Exhibitors or their assistants not obeying the directions of the Society's officers will render themselves liable to expulsion from the showground.
- 9 Water will be available for stock but exhibitors must provide any food or litter required.
- 10 The Society reserves the right to cancel or amalgamate classes unless there is a minimum of three entries in the class. The Society reserves the right to amend the judging times of classes but the order and timing published will be adhered to as far as possible.
- 11 The Society reserves the right to sanction a judge to withhold any of the prizes offered if in the judge's opinion the exhibits do not possess sufficient merit.
- 12 A veterinary inspector will be appointed and if required, will examine each exhibit selected by the judges for a prize to ascertain that such exhibit is practically sound for the purpose for which it is exhibited
- 13 All senior bulls must have two capable adult handlers in attendance in the show rings and in the Grand parade.
- 14 The Society's veterinary surgeons may on their own authority give to an animal such emergency treatment, as they may consider appropriate in the event that the owner or his representative cannot be found immediately. Exhibitors are required to meet the full cost of this treatment and any other costs involved in connection with any veterinary treatment given on the showground.

- 15 The Main Committee or officials appointed by them shall be empowered to disqualify and demand the removal from the showground of any animal which, in their opinion, is suffering from, of affected with, a contagious or infectious disease, and all entry fees for such animals shall be forfeited.
- Any person who wishes to lodge an objection against any exhibitor must do so in writing and hand it in to the Show Manager's marquee on the showground before 3pm on show day or, if later, within half an hour of completion of the judging of the class involved. A deposit of £50 must accompany each objection, which sum will be forfeited to the Society in cases where the objector does not sustain the objection. The Society's Main Committee shall consider the objection at its next meeting and its decision shall be final.
- 17 A Grand Parade of cattle, sheep and horses, as placed 1st and 2nd, will take place in the Main Ring at 3pm. Prize winners are responsible for their exhibits being paraded. Failure to do so will render them liable to forfeit the respective prize. The Chief Steward of each section has discretionary powers to excuse the parading of an animal where it is unruly and likely to upset or cause damage to other animals, attendants, the general public or property. No stock shall be removed from the showground until after the Grand Parade.
- 18 Payment of prize money and the issuing of trophies will be made on show day. Prize money will be available from the following locations; Cattle and Sheep: Livestock Rings. Trophies will be available for collection from the following locations; Cattle and Sheep: Livestock marque in the cattle lines. The Society reserves the right to deem any prize money not collected on show day as a donation to the Society. Each winner of a trophy shall give the Society a written guarantee to return the cup in good condition to Chadwell Grange, Newport, Shropshire, not later than 2nd June in the year following the show. The cost of returning trophies shall be borne by the exhibitor.
- The Society takes all reasonable measures to ensure the health and safety of everyone present on the showground. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instruction of the organisers and all officials and stewards. The Society, its officers and servants or agents shall not be responsible for any loss, injury or damage however caused to the exhibitor and the exhibitor agrees to indemnify the Society in respect of any costs in connection with any claims made upon the Society as a result of action or omission of the exhibitor or any employee of the exhibitor. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any animal, article or property exhibited or brought on to the showground by him and he shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be so caused or occasioned.
- 20 If it is proved to the reasonable satisfaction of the Main Committee that any person has attempted to gain a prize in the show by false certificate or by misinterpretation of any kind, such person shall at once be disqualified and excluded from again exhibiting at the Society's show, and be expelled therefrom and forfeit all prizes he would have been entitled to.
- 21 In the case of any differences of opinion as to the meaning or construction of the by-laws, such differences shall be decided by the Main Committee, whose decision shall be final.
