RULES

1. To enable the Committee to make the necessary arrangements, all entries (excluding BSJA Jumping classes and the Light Horse section, and Private Driving) must be made on or before **Thursday 18 April 2013**. Entries on the day will be taken to the above noted sections at £15 per entry until 12 noon. **Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by the appropriate entry fee and documents.**
2. All exhibitors of cattle, sheep and horses (except for showjumpers) must be members of the Association.
3. **It is solely the responsibility of the exhibitor to present his/her animal for judging at the appropriate time. The stewards and/or show officials will not be held responsible should an exhibitor fail to present his/her animal for judging at the appropriate time.**
4. All prize winners to be paraded when required under penalty of forfeiture of all prizes by the owners of any animal not paraded when required. This rule will be strictly enforced.
5. **Prize Money Vouchers will be given to prize winners along with the Rosettes and must be exchanged at the Secretary's Office before 5.00 pm on Show day. Except in classes where an unresolved objection has been lodged, or where classes are still being judged, any Prize Money not claimed on Show day will be forfeited and no claims will thereafter be entertained.**
6. All cattle entered must be accredited.
7. To enable the Committee to make necessary arrangements in erecting the showyard, exhibitors are requested to specify when any animal is entered in more than one class.
8. All stock shown must have been **TWO MONTHS AT LEAST** in possession of the exhibitor. Any infringement of this rule will render the exhibitor liable to be expelled from the Association, and all prize money gained will be forfeited.
9. The ages of all animals shall be computed from 1 January in their respective years, except in the cases especially mentioned in the Premium List.
10. All calves born on or after 1 July 1999 must have a properly completed passport which must be available on request during the period of the Show. This is the responsibility of the keeper of the animal. **If requested by an exhibitor, Section Stewards will have authority to sign cattle passports on behalf of the Association.**
11. Brood mares must be four years old and upwards. Foals must be at least three weeks old on Show day.
12. **No Substitutions** will be permitted in any Horse or Pony class, with the exception of BSJA and Draught Horse classes. Substitutions for Draught Horses may be accepted, at the Secretary's discretion.
13. No entries of Herd Book Cattle will be accepted unless accompanied by Guaranteed Pedigree, which must state the Name and Herd Book Number of the sire and dam.
14. Breeding cows must be in calf, or have had a calf within the twelve months previous to the Show.
15. Animals of any age that have had a calf must be shown as cows.
16. All stock eligible to compete in Open and Confined classes shall be entitled to win prizes in either.
17. **Exhibitors with MV/CAE Accredited flocks/herds must give a green SAC valid Certificate of Status to the Steward on entry to the showfield BEFORE unloading any animals.**
18. No person, with the exception of the competitors in a current class, Judges, Stewards, Members of Committee, Stock Leaders and the Secretary is to enter any of the rings.
19. Stock handlers must be in attendance at the animals' heads at 9.45 am and 2.00 pm, in readiness for Judging and the Parade of Stock.
20. **Should an animal appear to be uncontrollable, during judging or in the Parade of Stock, the Convener will have authority to inform the exhibitor/handler to immediately return the animal to its pen/lorry.**
21. Stock is not to be removed until after the Grand Parade without prior permission from a Committee Member.
22. **A miracle milker will be available to assist in milking dairy exhibits.**
23. All persons in charge of stock and other exhibits, and all persons admitted to the Showyard, shall be subject to the Rules of the Association and obey the Order of Committee, Secretary, and other Officials of the Association.
24. No animal will be taken out of its stall or pen after the judging has commenced, except by Order of Committee, or with the permission of the Secretary. Stock will not be allowed to stand about the Showyard in groups. Those infringing this rule will be liable to a fine of £10 or may be expelled from the Showyard.
25. Exhibitors shall be answerable for the conduct of their representatives.
26. Competitors will not be notified of any change of judge after publication of the Premium List, see website for updates.
27. Where only one competitor is entered in a section it is at the discretion of the show committee to amalgamate sections.
28. The Committee reserves the right of refusing any entries they may think fit, to exclude or cancel any entry made, or to prohibit the exhibition of any stock, and also to cancel any class, or to withhold any of the prizes if there are not sufficient competitors, or to make enquiries into a breach of the Rules and Regulations without any protest from any exhibitor.
29. The Association will not be responsible for any loss or damage whatsoever.
30. **A double manned fully equipped Paramedic Ambulance Corps will be on the showfield from 8.00 am on Show Day. To help defray this additional expenditure a fee of £2 per exhibitor of cattle, sheep, horses, ponies, goats and trade stands is being charged (as noted on the Entry Forms).**
31. The winners of Trophies are to give security to the Association for their return on or before next year's Show. **Trophies must be returned to the Secretary on or before 18 May 2013.**

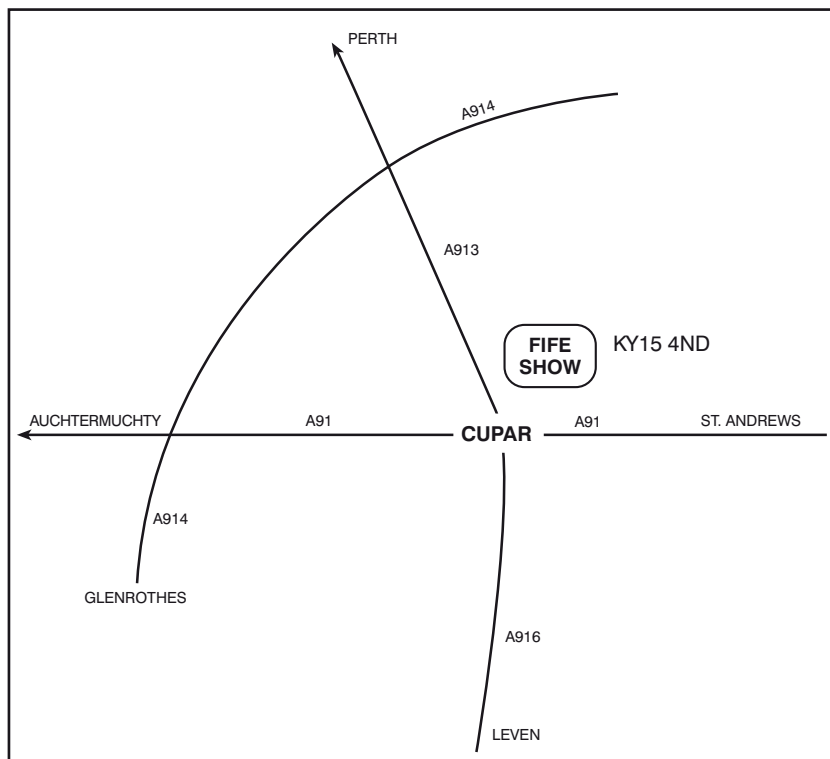
