long before Whinfellpark had made its mark on cattle breeding on a global scale.

The quest for the 'perfect' Limousin has led to the business being involved in no fewer than four world record-price breaking purchases. The most recent was in May, when a Limousin bull was purchased for 180,000gns, with a 25 per cent share sold post-sale to Boden and Davies Ltd, of the Cheshire-based Sportsman herd.

The record-breaking bull was the November 2020-born Graiggoch Rambo, entered by Gerwyn Jones of Conway. Mr Douglas describes Rambo as "one of the best Limousin bulls I have ever seen" with the purchase smashing the previous Limousin bull sale record of 140,000gns, which was in fact paid in 2015 by another syndicate which included A.W. Jenkinson Farms.

"My first thought was that Rambo represented something very close to the ideal British Limousin," says Mr Douglas. "A percentage of Carlisle buyers are looking primarily for a sire to produce breeding bulls. Their priorities are plenty of muscle at the back end and four good feet and legs, as well as breed character and style.

"Rambo has it all. His breeding is

he name Whinfellpark is synonymous with British Limousin cattle breeding, as the herd has hit the headlines on numerous occasions through its record pricebreaking purchases. Owner, Allan Jenkinson of A.W. Jenkinson Forest Products, is supported at Clifton Moor Farm on the Whinfell Park Estate by a team which includes stockman, Craig Douglas. He works alongside his father, David, under the guidance of farm manager, lain Scott.

Based near Penrith, the 125-cow herd is split roughly equally between spring and autumn-calving groups, in order to have stock to present at all the Carlislebased Borderway Mart shows and sales; a key feature in the British Limousin Cattle Society calendar.

The team's success has been achieved within a relatively short period, in terms

of cattle breeding. Mr Jenkinson was brought up on one the Estate holdings, Clifton Moor Farm, where the business used to be focused on buying and finishing commercial store cattle. A decision to switch to pedigree cattle breeding was made after the foot-and-mouth outbreak.

Craig Douglas explains:

"We were looking for an alternative to the previous system when the farm was re-stocked and it was a toss-up between the British Limousin and one of the other prominent beef breeds. The late auctioneer, David Thomlinson, strongly advised us to choose the Limmy and for that we owe him a debt of gratitude."

The first purchases for the pedigree herd were made up of French imports, followed by an investment in bloodlines from the dispersal of the renowned Ryedale herd. Numbers expanded slowly and it was not

exceptional, going back to Broadmeadows Cannon, Ronick Gains and Wilodge Vantastic. Rambo's semen will be available this year and we think he will be a huge asset to the herd."

Mr Douglas points to a second element of the market at Carlisle, where producers are seeking a bull primarily to produce outstanding females. Therefore, Whinfellpark breeding decisions are taken with both sire types in mind. Mr Douglas describes these twin aims as requiring a "fine balancing act." It has resulted in the relatively rare decision to retain a homebred bull.

"Whinfellpark Rightdecision was originally destined for the sale ring, but we think he has the ability to throw top quality calves of either sex. He was kept on quite by chance and with hindsight it was a very fortunate sequence of events. The bull has excellent breeding, but he came up slightly lame before his scheduled sale and although he was quick to recover, he was too old to qualify for the showing class on the following sale date. Rightdecision will be on show at the open day with his first batch of females and we have high hopes for his progeny."

Rightdecision's rare dual-purpose qualities are likely to be associated with his breeding. He is out of a cow by Dolcorsllwyn Fabio and sired by Gunnerfleet Lion; a bull which stands out as the most positive influence on the herd in recent times, comments Mr Douglas.









"It is no exaggeration to state that Lion has put Whinfellpark on the map. He will breed fantastic males and females and he has turned out to be worth every penny of our 22,000gns bid. His bull calves are not lacking in size and muscle definition, while his heifers demonstrate strong female characteristics. Lion has produced a 24,000gns bull for us, as well as several which have made 18000, 17000, 11500 and 11000. Heifers 15000, 10000 and 8000. He is not one of our most expensive purchases, but certainly one of the best.

"When it comes to homebred bulls, by far the most outstanding to date is Whinfellpark Lomu; we had his sire, Lowerffrydd Empire. Lomu is out of Whinfellpark Femi, a quality cow from which we have harvested a large number of embryos."

Two other stock bulls will be running with the cows at the open day event. One is the 18,000gns Pabo Proctors, purchased at Carlisle in 2020. The other is Cartronfree Powershift, bought privately for an undisclosed sum

Whinfellpark has won several prestigious show awards, with 2016 an exceptionally good year for the herd. The female Clittered won a sheaf of titles, including reserve inter-breed at the Royal Highland

and reserve overall at the National Limousin Show, as well as red ribbons at three agricultural shows in her native Cumbria. Meanwhile, the co-owned Trueman Jagger beat Glittered at the National Limousin Show to take the supreme championship that year.

A significant amount of income has been generated by semen sales and A.W. Jenkinson Farms Bovine Genetics was set up in 2012 to market the bulls in-house. It offers a choice of two dozen sires, with one of the oldest bulls 'on the books' also one of the most popular, says Mr Douglas.

"The 50,000gns Wilodge Cerberus was a 2008 Carlisle purchase. He has been used extensively across our own herd and straws have been marketed worldwide. By Wilodge Tonka and out of Wilodge Priceless, Cerberus falls into the top one per cent for 200 and 400-day growth rates and he has two copies of the F94L 'profit' gene. He has sired a 65,000gns bull and his progeny have enjoyed numerous show successes."

Herd management is kept fairly simple, with spring calvers turned out with their calves as soon as grass levels permit and the calves weaned at housing, while autumn-born calves run with their dams until turnout time. The cows are fed a winter diet of wheat straw, silage and molasses, along with a small quantity of rolled barley. The youngstock are reared mainly on a proprietary coarse mix.

The Limousin's superb conformation means that cattle that are not required for breeding have the potential to command high finished prices, says Mr Douglas. It is not unusual to achieve £2.000/ head at Carlisle for 13-month-old bulls weighing 600kgs. Some batches are sold deadweight, with the majority grading E1 and E2. The entire herd is managed using an electronic identification system.

The single-span, loose housing for the cows and calves has been built to a high standard, but further improvements have recently been made to the layout and the fixtures and fittings, including a curved

handling system complete with a fully automatic crush. Open Day visitors will also be able to view a newly-constructed layout for winter housing.

Mr Douglas joined the team a decade ago, having worked with a number of other cattle breeds. He feels fortunate to have found a job which fits in perfectly with his all-consuming 'hobby' of cattle breeding.

"The conformation of the British Limousin is second to none," he says. "I enjoy working with the breed and all members of our team are striving towards a common goal, which is to continue to improve the quality of the Whinfellpark herd.

"We have come quite a long way and our progress is illustrated by the fact that we no longer use the lower end of the females as embryo recipients. They are too valuable and therefore they have been replaced by the Fleckvieh.

"The British Limousin has the size and power that the market requires and

it is a great all-rounder. Like all cattle breeders, we are never satisfied and we will continue to work towards the achievement of perfection. That may never happen, but it does not mean that we will stop trying," says Mr Douglas.

Introducing IVP to improve your herd's potential

Cattle breeders seeking to improve their herd's genetic potential are introducing In-Vitro embryo Production (IVP), a cost effective service from East Lothian based specialist artificial breeding technology company, AB Europe.

"The IVP process produces embryos from collected oocytes (unfertilised eggs)," explains AB Europe's Gavin Tait. "The oocytes are fertilized within AB Europe's IVP lab in a petri dish by selected semen, and subsequently cultured for seven days until fully developed embryos can be transferred or frozen.

"IVP is a widely used method globally for producing embryos where it is starting to outcompete MOET for its flexibility and multiple benefits to breeders and their donor animals.

"AB Europe offers flexible options for donor programming. These programmes can be tailored to suit breeders' requirements whether donors are in-calf, or empty, under 15 months or older, or problematic in terms of fertility.

"Our primary donor programme involves mild stimulation, which requires six hormone injections prior to collection. Stimulation often leads to a boost in oocyte quality on a given collection; it can also improve the number of oocytes. Stimulated collections can be carried out on a fortnightly basis.

"Our alternative donor programme involves no line-up or donor programming. However results are more variable in comparison to stimulated donors as it relies on the natural response and fertility of the individual donor. Collections can be carried out weekly."

IVP is successfully delivering for Limousin breeders.



"I could have continued to naturally expand the herd, however I became aware of IVP which has actually put Westpit on the map. IVP was preferred

to MOET because no stimulation is required and the AB Europe team arrive on the farm to collect, whereas MOET requires multiple injections along with accompanying time, effort and cost.

"Brockhurst Holy was the first female to undergo IVP, primarily as an insurance policy. We achieved 20 calves, including 18 bulls of which 16 sold to pedigree herds. Other collections have resulted in calves collecting the silverware at Stars of the Future and society shows, whilst selling privately to leading herds. Sale ring highlights include junior champion, Westpit Oklahoma at 13,000gns."

"It's all about quality, not quantity; we've carefully invested in some of the best bloodlines and IVP is helping us to exploit those genetics

to their full potential. And it's proving to be a very cost-effective process. We have used IVP on four of our Limousin herd's foundation females including the 24,000gns Brockhurst Howzat, and realised a 75% hold rate for the 19 embryos we've implanted in purchased high health commercial recipients. We are very selective which sires we use, and are able to use just the one semen straw over all the embryos which makes for massive cost savings."
